# The Father's Heart

Understanding how to be a Dad in this world is dependent on firstly being able to be a son of God. When we speak of the Father's heart, it is about gaining an understanding of how our heavenly Father views us and how we need to view Him.

The manifestation of God's name as Father was first documented in John 17 verse 5: And now O Father, Glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with you before the world was. I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word.

As most parents are aware, children see their parents as a constant form of supply. Society has conditioned us to believe that the role of the parent is to provide, yet, spiritually we view God the opposite way. There is a perception that God is looking down on us and judging our behaviour but we have a father who looks down upon us as His precious sons and daughters. The church is not a place where we highlight people's failures and shortcomings because God does not see that, He sees us as His children, not as servants. As parents, we have an abundance of grace for our children.

It is surprising that the longer we are in church, the more we move away from having a 'sonship' mentality to having a 'servant' mentality. We always need to see God as our Abba Father. When we see Him as our Abba, we walk in a relationship of constant blessing, but when we do not see his heart for us, we become frustrated.

We need to stop having a religious relationship with our Abba Father because we miss out on what it's like to know God. In the parable of The Prodigal Son in Luke 15, Jesus describes the heart of God. An inheritance was divided amongst both sons. An inheritance is usually given after death - Jesus died to give us our inheritance.

In the parable of the prodigal son, both sons received their inheritance at the same time. Prodigal living is not about judging your sin, it is about living in a way that robs you and destroys you of your identity in God. Anything outside of God's blessing is famine, there is no multiplication. We are beloved and well pleasing to God. Be careful of the voices you let give you place, purpose and identity. If we go back to the parable of the prodigal son, verse 20 tells us that when the son was still a great way off, the father saw him. A father's first emotion is compassion. Caring moved him into action. He ran towards his son and repeatedly kissed him. Even though the son was unclean, the father embraced him and showered him with his love. He requested for the best robe to be placed on him, a ring to be placed on his finger and sandals for his feet.

God does not focus on us being lost; He focuses on us being found. God has given us His most valuable possession, His Son Jesus. We have God as our Abba Father! Perhaps you are struggling as a parent in your relationship with your children. We encourage you to love your children unconditionally, as God loves us, no matter what the situation might be. Continually sow into their lives and speak over their destiny and future, trusting that God will do a work both in their lives and yours. Trust God to restore and heal the relationships with your children that may be broken and know that He will redeem the time.

Thank you for your teachings and everything you have done for me.



Join Steven Curtis Chapman, Tauren Wells, Jillian Edwards, and Scotty Smith for a night honouring the men we call Dadl



It was such an incredible time of worshipping and praising the Lord together as we took ownership of the building.


